

Making Sense



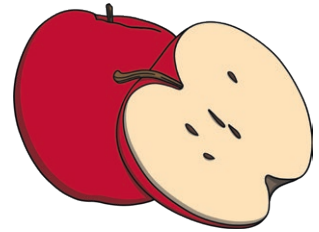
Sentences have lots of different parts. They have capital letters, full stops and can contain lots of different types of words. But one of the most important things about a sentence is that it must make sense!
