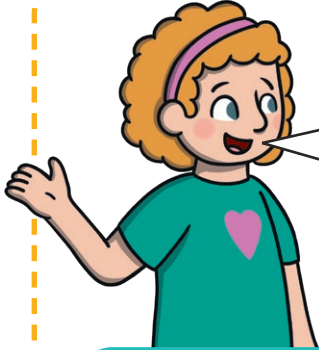


Question Marks



Question marks are a type of punctuation. We use a question mark at the end of a question. The question below uses a question mark. A question mark acts as a full stop, so a capital letter should be used afterwards. Questions often start with a question word. Question words include;

Where, When, Who, What, Why, Can, How, Whose

Example:

question word

→ **Can we go to the park?** ←

question mark
