Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to introduce myself as the new Chair of Governors at the school and to outline the role of governors at St Michael's. I have been part of The Governing Body since September 2018 but have had a long association with the school as a parent in the 90s/00s, when I was chair of The Friends, and as the leader at St Michael's Pre-school until 2017.

What Governors do

The governing board is the school's legally accountable body and must operate in the best interests of the school. The task of the governing board is to lead the school strategically, at St Mchael's this is focusing on the three core functions:

- 1. Ensuring clarity and implementation of the school's unique Christian vision, ethos and strategic direction runs through all aspects of school life.
- 2. Holding the school leaders to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils and the effective and efficient performance management of staff.
- 3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure that its money is well spent

How we Work

The Governing Body has established two main committees:

- Finance and Resources (FRC)
- Learning and Pupil Progress (LPP)

The full governing body and two main committees meet each school term.

We have two other committees which meet only occasionally, or when the need arises:

- The Admissions Committee
- The Complaints committee
