This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

## Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

All children at St. Michael's receive weekly, class music lessons (45minutes – 1 hour) using the Charanga Scheme (see curriculum statement and plans on the website). We have percussion instruments as well as a whole class set of glockenspiels to enhance learning. The extra half class set was purchased for this academic year.

We have also purchased a half set of ukuleles and pbuzz instruments, to enable classes from Years 2-5 to experience learning a woodwind and a stringed instrument. These class lessons are given by a music teacher in half class sessions.

Year 3 have a term of ukulele with follow on lessons in Years 4 & 5 for half a term.

Year 2 have a term of learning pbuzz.

There is a weekly singing practice for the whole school and classes enjoy singing as part of the curriculum as well.

The children take part in church services at least once in a half term and singing is an integral part of this.

## **Part B Extra-curricular music**

At St. Michael's there are opportunities for children to have individual or group music lessons in recorder, flute, piano, guitar, ukulele and pbuzz. Many children take exams, and these certificates are celebrated on our website as well as in our weekly celebration assembly.

The children that take part in these lessons are given the opportunity to perform in front of a small audience of parents/carers and to perform in front of the school in an assembly. Some children have played their instrument as part of a class assembly as well.

Choir for Years 3-6 is offered as a weekly after school club, as well as extra rehearsals some lunchtimes. This year the choir are going to sing at Wembley as part of Young Voices. This is a new venture for us.

For some of the instrumental lessons, children have borrowed school ukuleles and pbuzzes. Pupil Premium children can ask for a subsidised weekly lesson, as part of the school initiative to pay for one club each week (See PP Strategy)

## **Part C: Musical events & performances**

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

In reception and KS1 the classes perform musical nativities, and, in all classes, music is a cross-curricular part of class assemblies. KS2 perform a carol service in December in church with classes performing a song, instruments being played and whole school singing. Our half termly visit to church always involves singing at least 3 songs/hymns which the children have practiced.

A termly music concert showcases individuals and groups in small groups or as part of a whole school assembly with parents/carers invited as well.

## In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

- In the future we would like to have a dedicated space for music lessons, which would then enable us to introduce more 'noisy' instruments such as drums.
- We want to continue with a school choir and an event during the year where they can sing with other schools
- We would like to have a school orchestra and will investigate the possibility of this
