Maths:

- Recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p).
- Solve simple problems involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change.
- Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division.
- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables.
- Recognise odd and even numbers.
- Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure length/height in any direction (m/cm); mass (kg/g); temperature (°C) and capacity (litres/ml).
- Compare and order lengths, mass, volume/capacity and record the results using >, < and =.

English:

- Present handwriting neatly with letters sitting on the line and use appropriate ascenders and descenders.
- Form capital letters and digits of the correct size.
- Write sentences with full stops and capital letters.
- Spell many common exception words.
- Use coordination (e.g. or / and /but) and some subordination (e.g. when/ if/ that / because) to join clauses.
- Use present and past tense mostly correctly and consistently.
- Explain what has happened in a text.
- Make predictions and inferences based on their knowledge of a text.

Our key texts are: Wolves, The Bear and the Piano, Bear Under the Stairs, the Owl and the Pussycat, If All the World Were, A Walk in London, Dragon Machine, The Great Fire of London and Toys in Space.


