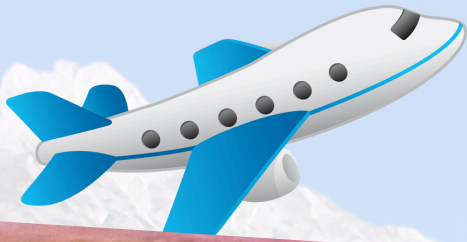




Innsbruck Day 2025
