

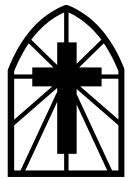

Oak Class Assembly on Technology

On Monday our Year 6 class presented PPTs in groups on technology and online safety. Some of the groups spoke about the 'Smarrt' rules, see below.

The SMARRT rules

- S – SAFE** Keep personal information like pictures, names, passwords or address offline and protect your information and others' by making strong passwords. Follow your home or school system for reporting problems.
- M – MEETING** Just because you are meeting someone online it doesn't make it safe - check with a trusted adult before meeting/talking with anyone new online, and tell a trusted adult if anyone asks to meet in person. They could be anyone.
- A – ACCEPTING** It's really easy to quickly accept invitations by clicking links, opening e-mails, clicking on pictures etc. This is how many online viruses are spread so always check with a safe adult before you do this.
- R – RELIABLE** It's difficult to tell what information is reliable online, and to know if the people are really who they say they are. Remember that search engines and websites select and target information for you - they don't show you everything. Check information is accurate using more than one trustworthy source. Only chat online to friends and family you know in real life, and check with an adult before you talk to anyone new or use a new app.
- R – RIGHTS +** You need to treat people with respect and kindness. Think before you post, share or reply to someone in case it may be unkind or unhelpful. You also have rights about your personal data - to your privacy, to consent before your information is used, and to say 'no' to sharing information.
- T – TELL** If something online is worrying you or a friend, tell a trusted adult. If it is making you feel uncomfortable, listen to your instinct and talk to someone who can help you work out if something is not right, and what you can do next.

This was part of their PSHE work at the end of last half term and as part of online safety we looked back on how technology has changed over the years (remember floppy discs and tape recorders, you're probably all too young!)

Pupil Behaviour

You may remember that early last term we had some staff training from 'Therapeutic Thinking' about a

Benedict's Law



In September Benedict's Law (also known as the schools [Allergy Safety] Bill) is mandatory statutory guidance and legislation for schools in England that requires all schools to implement rigorous allergy

safety protections, including dedicated whole-school allergy policies, comprehensive staff training, and the provision of emergency adrenaline auto-injectors (AAIs). We have already actioned some of this guidance in that staff are undertaking training and we have spare auto-injectors on the wall (thank you Mr. Lawson). We also have 16 staff trained in paediatric 1st Aid, which includes allergy training. When our policy has been approved, we will share it with you, and it will be on our website.
