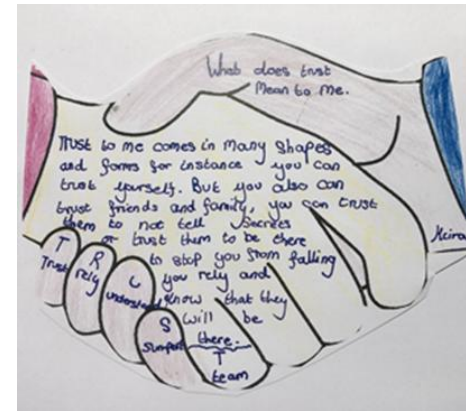

We have a lunchtime Nurture Club and celebrate whole school wellbeing with an annual event focusing on nature, the environment, kindness to others and so on.



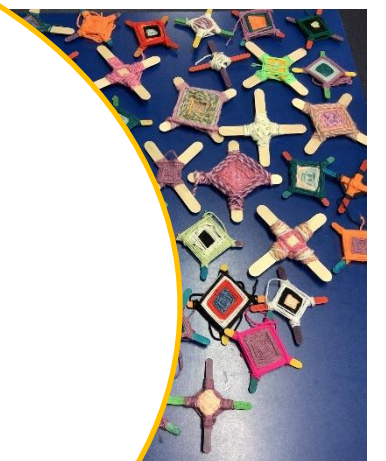

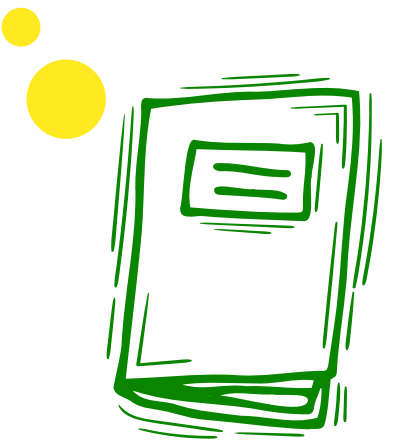

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Physical Activity & Outdoor Learning

At St Michael's we are very lucky to have lots of sporting activities for the children to engage in. We have our Platinum Sports Award, for participation in sport both in and out of school, as well as the variety of sport on offer, both competitive and non-competitive. We also have sports leaders who encourage activities at lunchtimes.

We encourage outdoor learning and play, through our dedicated Forest School area as well as more generally on the field and playground. We have just had a sandpit installed for all children to enjoy at breaktimes, as well as a construction area and zones for different activities to be creative or to learn a new sport.

We encourage everyone to walk, scooter or cycle to school and for those living further away the Village Hall is a great place to park and enjoy a 5-minute walk. We have pupils in Year 5 as Active Travel Ambassadors and many year groups have a road safety session for pedestrian skills, safe scootering, bikeability and road safety distractions.



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Music

We love music at St Michael's and have class set of glockenspiels and a half class set of ukuleles and pBuzz instruments.

Ukulele is taught in Years 3, 4 & 5 by a specialist teacher and the glockenspiels are used as part of our class music lessons. PBuzz is taught in Year 2, which is a pre-runner for learning the trumpet. There is a school choir that will be taking part in 'Young Voices' at Wembley Arena.

We are very lucky to have our own music teachers who offer individual tuition for recorder, flute, violin, piano, guitar and ukulele. These lessons are paid for by parents but take place during the school day.

We have a Music Hub which will give us the opportunity to enrich our music curriculum.

Leaders focus strongly on developing pupils' skills and interests beyond the curriculum. Pupils can choose from a wide range of sports, including archery, golf and lacrosse. They enjoy learning to play musical instruments such as the ukulele and glockenspiel. Ofsted Nov. 22



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Phonics in Early Years and KSI

Twinkl Phonics provides a cohesive whole school approach, building continuously on prior learning. By following one scheme, we can establish a progressive, consistent phonics curriculum where children progress and succeed.

To create as many multisensory hooks as possible, Twinkl Phonics uses a set of mnemonics, actions and songs that link to each sound within levels 2 and 3.

Many of our reading books are directly linked to the phonics progression and are available online as well as a physical book. Children in reception and KS1 are given a login to Twinkl to access resources. In addition we have Collins Big Cat books to supplement home reading.

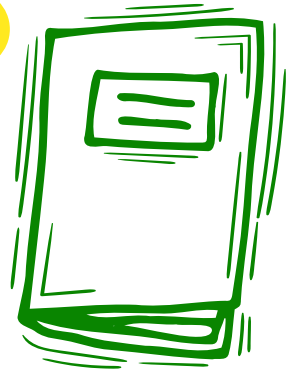

Volunteers

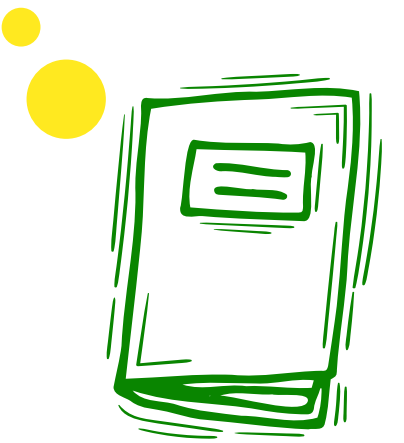
We have many volunteers from the local area who come in to hear children read and run a lunchtime knitting club as well.

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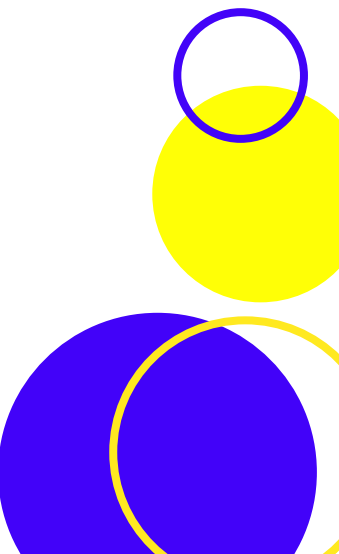
Lunches at St. Michael' s

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Wrap Around Care

This is run by Mr. Shepherd, (Herts Sports Academy) who also provides professional development for teachers in P.E. Breakfast Club starts at 7.30am each morning and after school club runs until 6.00pm Monday to Thursday. Each session as a themed physical activity as part of the earlier session and food is served for those staying later.

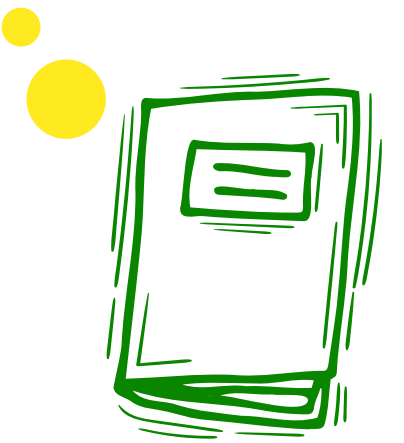
